³ HMS *Duke of Wellington* was a 131-gun first-rate ship of the line of the Royal Navy. Launched in 1852, she was symptomatic of an era of rapid technological change in the navy, being powered both by sail and steam. An early steam-powered ship, she was still fitted with towering masts and trim square-set yards, and was the flagship of Sir Charles Napier.

⁴ She was reduced to 50 guns in 1830 and then became a training school in 1860, being renamed HMS Eaglet in 1918. She was lost in a fire in 1926; the wreck was sold in 1927.

⁵ *Dreadnought* was the first battleship of her era to have a uniform main battery, rather than having a few large guns complemented by a heavy secondary battery of smaller guns. She was also the first capital ship to be powered by steam turbines, making her the fastest battleship in the world at the time of her completion. She did not participate in any of World War I's naval battles as she was being refitted during the Battle of Jutland in 1916. This was the only time that British dreadnought battleships fired on their German counterparts during the war. She became the only battleship to sink a submarine when she rammed the SM *U-29* when it unexpectedly broke the surface after firing a torpedo at another Dreadnought in 1915.

⁶ Launched in 1815 as a 120-gun first-rate ship of the line. On harbour service from 1841, used as a training ship from 1862, and sold in 1906.

⁷ Built specifically to serve as a coastal defence ship for the harbour of Bombay (now Mumbai) in the late 1860s. She was ordered by the India Office for the Bombay Marine. The original specifications were thought to be too expensive and a cheaper design was ordered. While limited to harbour defence duties, the breastwork monitors were described by Admiral George Alexander Ballard as being like". Aside from gunnery practice *Magdala* remained in Bombay Harbour for her entire career. The ship was sold for scrap in 1903.

⁸ In 1900 HMS Benbow was Greenock guardship.

⁹ Launched in 1859 as HMS Duncan. She was renamed HMS Pembroke on her transferral to harbour service in 1890, renamed HMS Tenedos II in 1905 and was sold in 1910.

¹⁰ Launched in 1889. She was converted to a minesweeper in 1909.

¹¹ Launched in 1886. She was used for harbour service from 1910, and as a training ship from 1919, when she was renamed HMS *Dryad*. She was sold in 1924.

¹² Launched in Britain in 1863. She served as a supply ship from 1897 to 1941, and gave her name to the shore station HMS *Tamar* in Hong Kong (1897 to 1997).

 $^{^{13}}$ HMS Aboukir was sunk by the German submarine U-9, together with two of her sister ships, on 22 September 1914; 527 men died aboard the ship.
